

Uniform


PE continued

PE kit is a white plain top, grey/black leggings/trousers, black plimsolls/trainers. **Absolutely NO Jewellery is allowed to be worn on these days.**



Jewellery

Please be aware that the school policy is that no jewellery is to be worn in school. A plain, simple watch is acceptable as are stud earrings. Children should not wearing any hanging earrings, bracelets or necklaces for safety reasons. If you wish your child to wear any religious items then please speak to their teacher who can advise on safety.



Intimate Care

Please speak to the staff if your child is still wearing nappies or pull-ups. We can work together to ensure they are fully toilet trained. We appreciate that accidents do happen so you are welcome to send in several changes of clothes in a named bag.


Book Bags

All children will need to bring a book bag in to school every week for Nursery - on Fridays, and daily for Reception children. We provide a story book to share daily with your child. You can read the story together and then as you look at each page ask some questions to develop understanding and concentration.



All pupils will be bringing home phonic sheets each week to practise at home. Please spend five minutes a day saying the sounds and writing them together, as well as thinking about the words that start with that sound.

Example questions you can ask when reading books together:



- What can you see in this picture?
- What do you think they are doing?
- What might happen next?



Tapestry

We use an electronic recording system, Tapestry, to monitor progress here at Downsell Primary. Please ensure that you are logging on and looking at your child's progress and please leave some remarks to let us know what they are learning at home!
