Our school is expecting to be awarded £20,550 for the academic year 2021-22, and we plan on using the funding as outlined below:

To increase participation in competitive sport	£2,000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Membership of Waltham Forest School Sports Network (WFSSN) allows competitive inter-school competitions with other schools of the borough in a range of sports</li> <li>• Intra-school competitions in a range sports, including Sports Games Day (for year groups that returned during COVID 19 lockdown)</li> <li>• All children have the opportunity to take part in competitive sport and have their efforts celebrated with the whole school</li> </ul>
