## **The Gray Wolf**

The most common type of wolf, which is called the Gray Wolf, has grey and brown fur; its tail is long and bushy. When you first look at them, you will notice that they have long snouts and pointed ears on top of their heads; these features are common for most wolves. Gray wolves mainly inhabit Europe and Asia. They will move from territory to territory based on the amount of food and water available to them.

Gray wolves like to consume a range of different types of food:

- Rodents that the wolves hunt for in their packs;
- Fruits that fall off of nearby trees;
- Berries which are not poisonous;
- Fish that live in the stream.

Contrary to popular belief, gray wolves do not always hunt in packs; sometimes they hunt independently.
