Applying for a Reception place for September 2020

If your child was born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016 they are due to start in Reception class at a primary school from September 2020.

You must apply for a Reception place for your child even if they attend a school nursery or have an older brother or sister at your preferred school. If your child currently attends a nursery attached to a school this does not give them any priority for a place in Reception at that school.

The booklet <u>Starting Primary School 2020</u> contains all the information you need to know about applying for a Reception class place. Please check the Latest Admissions Information below for updates to this booklet.

The <u>eAdmissions website</u> for online applications opens on 1 September and the closing date for on time applications is 15 January 2020. If you apply after 15 January your application will be considered as late and will be processed after all the on time applications.

If you and your child live in Waltham Forest you must apply through us. If you and your child live outside Waltham Forest, you must apply to the local authority in which you live. The <u>eAdmissions website</u> will redirect your application to the correct local authority based on the address and postcode you enter.

If you are unable to apply online you can download the <u>primary common appli-</u> <u>cation form</u>. Instructions for how to submit your paper application are on the back of the application form.
