SMSC is in an integral part of school life and the on-going education of all of our pupils. It is not a separate subject that is taught explicitly but an aspect of learning that is present in lessons and behaviour in school.

Through our curriculum planning and assemblies, together with enriching experiences, children have the opportunity to explore values and beliefs, including different religions and the way in which they impact on people's lives. Some lessons lend themselves more easily to direct SMSC development such as PSHE and RE. We ensure opportunities for developing the British Values through our SMSC.
