Welcome to everyone in this Spring 1 term. We hope you had a good break and are that the children are ready and enthusiastic about their learning in the coming weeks.

## Punctuality & Attendance



May we take this opportunity to remind you that punctuality is important as it gets the children in to a routine that sets positive early habits. We ask that all children arrive at school at the appropriate time, 8.55am for reception and 8.40am/12.30pm for nursery. Children arriving late can be disruptive for the other children and can upset those arrive after we have started our learning. Children that attend regularly are more likely to progress and achieve in their educational life. If your child is absent from school, please telephone the school on **020** 8556 **0103**, giving a reason for their absence or provide a note when they return to school. May we remind you to inform the school office if your contact details have changed.



## Spare Clothes

Across all of Early Years we take part in lots of active learning through play. This frequently involves getting dirty, messy or wet! It is important for all children to experiment and investigate the activities provided, and we ask that all children bring a change of clothes (in a named bag) in case of accidents. Please add additional items if your child is prone to frequent changes. Please ensure that <u>all</u> of your child's clothing is named.



### Behaviour & Rewards



Good behaviour and work is rewarded through progressing onto the **behaviour ladder**. A celebration assembly, where rewards are given out, will begin in reception this term on Friday afternoons. If your child is selected for an award you will be invited to attend the Friday assembly.

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## Reading Books

Reading books are sent home weekly as part of our support of their early reading development. Please read the books to your child and write comments in the reading record books concerning your child's interest or understanding. For nursery, please ensure that all book bags are in school on Friday afternoons.



## Homework


Homework in Early Years is all about reading. It is essential that you read with your child every day for ten minutes. This develops their attention and concentration, as well as continually developing their language and vocabulary skills.



## Writing their name

Want to help your child? Practise writing their name with them everyday for five minutes. Make sure they hold the pencil the correct way and support them to form the letters correctly. They learn the rhymes to write the letters in phonics. I have attached a set of the letters for you at the back of this newsletter.

# Rhymes for letter formation - taken from Read Write Inc.










Around the apple and down the leaf.
