### Weduc

We are delighted to announce that we have launched Weduc. This will become our main source of communication and has replaced the previous payment system – so all payments (meals, clubs, trips, before and after school care and any other ad-hoc payments) will now need to be made on this system.

#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

As explained in newsletters last term, the Local Authority have now introduced fines for non-attendance. This means that if your child has 10 or more unauthorised sessions (5 days), we will need to refer this to the Local Authority, who may then decide to issue a fine to both parents / carers.

Please remember that although you may give us a reason for your child's absence, this may not automatically be authorised. We need to consider if you have appropriate evidence and also look at your child's attendance overall. If your child's attendance is below 90% (persistent absentee) then we will not authorise any further absences. Please also note that term time holidays will not be authorised.
