Our school target for all of our pupils is 96%. Our attendance overall for last week (14.11.22 – 18.11.22) was 90.3% (Year 1 to Year 6).

Reminder

Last week's attendance was our lowest attendance to date for Years 1 - 6. We relaunched attendance again with the children in assembly today and we are reminding parents / carers of our expectations again in this newsletter and the attached leaflet.

This is the season where children get colds, coughs and runny noses. Whilst we do understand that it is difficult for parents / carers to see their child unwell with coughs and colds and that this may result in you wanting to keep your child at home, we do ask that you consider this decision very carefully. We take our advice directly from the NHS website in which it states that – "it's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold." If your child does become unwell or has a fever (38 degrees or above), then we will of course make contact with you to collect your child.

Please remember that:

- 1. Keeping your child off school for many periods, of what could be considered minor illness, may result in school not authorising any further absences.
- 2. If your child's attendance is already **significantly below** our school target of 96%, we may not authorise any further period of absences.
- 3. If it is noted on your child's attendance record that they have had many periods of vomiting and diarrhoea within short periods of time, we will be asking you for evidence of having visited the doctor for advice in case there are any medical problems we need to be aware off.
- 4. You should provide evidence of absence wherever possible.
