Waltham Forest Parent Forum is a friendly, voluntary group of parent/carers of children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities aged 0-25 in Waltham Forest.

WFPF provides a support group for parents and carers, where members can talk through their personal issues and get support as part of a group at an informal coffee morning.

They run a monthly autism specific support group for parents and a general coffee morning forum members, in which they occasionally invite guest speakers to give talks on a variety of topics chosen by members. WFPF also provides a Dads' support group run by dads in the forum. They meet twice a term and often invite guest speakers to come along to give an overview of their service.

Child Friendly Attendance Policy

Why do we need to come to school?

It's the law!

Being at school every day improves your chances of getting a job or going to college and university when you
get older.

- To learn new things.
- Being part of a group helps us to get on well with others and make friends.
- Educational visits help us to learn about the big wide world outside of school.
- Taking part in clubs and teams is fun and helps us to play together and get better at what we do.

What happens if you don't come to school?

- You may get behind with your learning.
- You miss out on special days, celebrations, educational visits, school clubs and team events.

What is good attendance?

- Downsell thinks 96% and above is what each person should aim for.
- Punctuality also counts towards good attendance. Being on time for school so we do not miss learning
 opportunities.
- You should always try to come to school unless you are REALLY ILL

What do I need to know to help me achieve the target of 96% or above?

Attendance percentage	Missed days of learning	Traffic light colour
100%	You would have had no days off school for the year!	
99%	You would have had 2 days off school for the whole year.	
97%	You would have had 5 days off school for the whole year.	
95%	You would have had 10 days off school for the whole year.	
90%	You would have had 20 days off school for the whole year.	
85%	You would have had 30 days off school for the whole year.	

Rewards

- Celebrate class achievement weekly celebration of classes with attendance 96% and above and termly class reward menu for the winning class to choose from.
- Half termly attendance statements sent out to parents.
- Termly attendance prize draw for those 96% and above and those who have the most improved attendance.
- End of year trip for those children with 100% all academic year.
