Computing: Information Technology/Coding and Online Safety

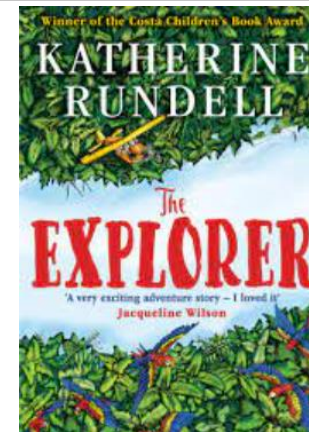
RE: Why do some people think that life is a journey?
