

Anti-Bullying Strategy

Area	Actions
Creating a shared definition of bullying	<p>Agreed definition to be shared at</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Staff meeting - Email to all staff - Posters around school - Assembly - Discussions in class - Parent / carer workshops <p>Anti-policy review to include shared definition. Anti-bullying class charters.</p>
Pupil voice	<p>In class discussion during anti-bullying week. Children to think about acts of kindness from others and themselves. Pupil voice questionnaires show that children understand what bullying is and know how to speak up about bullying. Show a reduction in bullying incidents.</p>
Teaching and modelling	<p>Anti-bullying is woven throughout the curriculum and children have opportunities to be explicitly taught about areas as well as supported to understand how to deal with and manage unpleasant situations. Anti-bullying week – in class discussions about the difference between rude, mean or bullying behaviour. Focussing on acts of kindness as a way to combat bullying.</p>
Raising awareness	<p>Anti-bullying week. Parent / carer workshop in classes. Anti-bullying class charters in place and shared with parents / carers.</p>
